What is Positive Reinforcement?

Positive Reinforcement is something that is added after a target behavior occurs to increase the future likelihood of that behavior occurring again in the future.

Why use Positive Reinforcement?

- Helps promote target replacement behaviors
- Aids in building motivation
- Aids in building rapport and instructional control
- Helps develop classroom management systems

What can Positive Reinforcement do?

Increase the likelihood of targeted behavior occurring in the future.
