General Fatherhood Statistics

- There are an estimated 72.2 million fathers in the United States
- <u>There are 2 million single fathers in the United</u> <u>States.</u>
- 17% of all single-parent households are single fathers
- 33% of all children (24.7 million) live in a home without their birth father (U.S. Census Bureau).
- In 1960 only 9.1% of children were living with a single parent; by 2012 the number had risen to 20.7% of all children
- <u>The percentage of children without a father in</u> the United States is 43% (US Census Bureau)
