FIT PROVIDER

FIT Provider will provide a list of children who are currently being served through Part C and who may be potentially eligible for Part B services under an established condition or determined to be developmentally delayed. They will be emailed/hand delivered by the end of every month and include the child's name, DOB and contact information. Part C will notify the district if there are no potentially eligible children for that district.

During the summer months, the FIT Provider and LEA representatives will come to an agreement on who will receive notifications.

If a child is referred to the FIT program <45 days before their 3rd birthday, the FIT provider will direct the family to the LEA in their district.

FIT Provider will:

- Obtain written parental consent prior to sharing confidential information with a partnering agency.
- Follow all confidentiality policies set forth by the NM Dept. of Health, Long Term Service Division, FIT Program.
- Inform parents of all confidentiality policies.

Upon request and release of information completed by community agencies, LEA will collaborate with community agencies to share information about children who may be identified as having a developmental delay (DD) or disability.

If the LEA does not receive notification from the EI agency at the time it is anticipated, the LEA will contact that agency.
