#### TIP

Native Americans with Medicaid may use Exempt/Free-for-Service, or select a Turquoise Care Managed Care Organization (MCO). IHS or Tribal Clinics and hospitals may be accessed. For those with complex needs, it may be beneficial to select an MCO as a Care Coordinator is only available through an MCO.
