Medically Fragile Waiver (MFW)



What is the MFW?

The Medically Fragile Waiver (MFW) serves people with both a medically fragile condition and a developmental disability by helping them in their homes.

(All services must be approved by a third party assessor.)

Receiving an Allocation

Once a waiver allocation is offered, recipients can choose between:

Medically Fragile Waiver (MFW)
or
Mi Via Self-Directed Waiver



Services

Services may include:

case management, community support, goods & services, private nursing, home health aide, specialized therapy, nutritional counseling, behavior support, respite, specialized medical equipment, environmental and vehicle modifications



Medical Eligibility

For medical eligibility, both a medically fragile condition and a developmental disability must be diagnosed prior to the age of 22. "Medically fragile" means needing ongoing nursing care, evaluation, and decision-making due to a complex chronic medical condition.



Financial Eligibility

Financial eligibility is based on the income and resources of the individual with the medically fragile condition, not the income of the parents or other household members.
