

What to Report While Receiving Social Security Disability Benefits

You must report changes in work, income and life to ensure timely and accurate payments.

Information you need to report:

- Changes in work status:
 - Stop working, change a job, or receive a new job offer.
 - Begin or end self-employment.
 - Have an increase or decrease of work hours or pay.

• Income from work:

• Wages from work if your gross monthly income is more than \$1,050 per month.

• Other income:

- Workers' compensation benefits.
- Public disability from a state or local government.

• Disability recovery:

• Significant improvement so your medical condition no longer affects your ability to work.

How to report:

- By phone: Call +1 800-772-1213, or TTY +1 800-322-0778 if you're deaf or hard of hearing.
- Online through my Social Security account https://www.ssa.gov/myaccount/.
- Mail or fax documents to your local office.
 Complete a <u>Statement of Claimant or Other Person (Form SSA-795) (PDF)</u>.Gather supporting information that includes:
 - A brief explanation of your work status or income change.
 - The data of the change.

Fax or mail the form along with any supporting documents to your local office.
